




Care and Maintenance 7.0

Maintenance




We believe that with regular care and maintenance that your lock will last a lifetime. Here's a suggested checklist to make sure you can always depend on TeacherLock in an emergency.

1. Test for function.

As seasons change and buildings settle, doors and frames can move. We have designed what we think is an adequate amount of play into the universal door strike. It's always a good idea to check for the free movement of the bolt on a periodic basis.

2. Look for loose or missing screws, tighten or replace as necessary.

3. Test for outdoor key function. The key should slide smoothly through hole and may need to be rotated into the correct position to push against the top of the lever, thereby disengaging the bolt. It is important to make sure that this hole is free of debris.



4. Do not use WD 40, solvents, or heavy lubricants. A drop or two of light oil on the bolt is fine.

5. Do not use harsh chemicals or oxidizers to clean. Just use simple soap and water or an alcohol based cleaner.
